Upon induction, the students receive a certificate of recognition, tassel, decal, and pin as being a part of the chapter.

"We are thrilled to announce our first members of the ETA NTHS Chapter," said Teresa Maher, ETA President. "This serves as a great way to distinguish students' accomplishments both inside and outside of the classroom, and another means to promote electronics education."

ETA serves as an honorary chapter for individuals and schools who do not have an NTHS chapter. The ETA NTHS recognition program is designed to give recognition to people who achieve excellence in the pursuit of technical education and training in the electronics or telecommunications career area.

To become a member of the chapter, individuals must meet the following requirements:

1. Must be pursuing studies in one of the electronics or telecommunications career areas through one of ETA's affiliate schools or through a recognized apprenticeship program.
2. Be an affiliate school whose course of study has been approved by ETA, or a school that has a resident ETA Certification Administrator.

A person must have demonstrated a degree of academic excellence in one of four (4) ways:

1. Completed at least 12 semester hours in electronics or telecommunications in a 12-month period while maintaining a 3.8 GPA on a 4.0 system, or its equivalent. The 12 semester hours must have been earned in at least three separate courses.
2. Completed 240 contact hours in electronics or telecommunications within a 12 month period while maintaining a 90% average. The 240 contact hours must represent at least three separate courses.
3. Completed four (4) separate ETA certifications with a 90% average within a 12-month period.
4. High school students must be enrolled in a technology program that can result in an ETA certification. They must have completed one (1) year in the program while maintaining a 3.5 overall average, and a 3.7 average in the technical program.
